


## Project History

- + The Road Commission had planned to widen this section of Baldwin Road for more than 20 years.
- Due to the size of the project and amount of federal funds involved, RCOC and the Township were required to conduct a multi-year, Federal Environmental Assessment.
- + Orion Township Trustees dedicate funds over the years for this project.
- + Orion Township creates a Corridor Improvement Authority to fund a portion of the landscaping and beautification.




## Funding

- + Total Cost: \$55 million
  - + State of Michigan Transportation Economic Development Fund (TEDF) Category C
  - + Federal
  - + 50/50 local match (RCOC and Orion Township)
  - + Orion Township Corridor Improvement Authority

## Additional Features

- + 8-foot non-motorized pathway added on both sides.
