THE PROBLEM

- 38% of material disposed of in MI is compostable
 - 3 million tons annually
- Of organic waste going to landfill, 46% is food waste
 - yard waste is only 9%
- In 2019, 1.64 Million Food Waste Tons were generated in MI
 - 660k Tons were from Residentiallargest category at 40.1%



95% of the food we dispose of ends up in the landfill, where it emits methane and contributes to climate change

OUR SOLUTION

Compost Drop-off Program

- One year pilot: Nov '21- Nov '22
- 5 Locations, 14 Carts
 - 896 gallon weekly capacity, 179 full 5 gallon buckets per week
- Dawn to dusk drop-off access- flexibility
- Weekly Cart Pick-Up
- All food waste accepted
 - "if it grows, it goes"
- Participant resources (food waste collection bucket, program print materials)


- 400 participants registered
- 376 buckets were distributed
- 400 follow-up surveys were sent,
 - 252 returned (so far)
- 51 residents have expressed interest in joining a future program
- 90 participants practiced composting prior to the program
 - Backyard, pick-up service, vermicompost







Residential Compost Users Pilot








Residential Compost Drop Off Locations




Residential Compost Users by Residence Size

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

After 23 weeks of residential pickup



TONNAGE

26,925 pounds 13.46 tons

63.62 TONS OF CO2

That's 14 vehicles driven for one year





2.67 MILLION GALLONS OF WATER

That's 4 olympic swimming pools





"I really enjoy composting and have noticed a vast reduction in the amount of trash we have each week. I would LOVE to have a curbside compost so that it is easier, picked up weekly with regular trash, and is more accessible to everyone."

FERNDALE RESIDENT

"I freaking love it. I have a home compost, but that's a dud in winter and having to formulate the mixture of greens and browns can be a bit of a pain. Since starting this pilot my household trash volume has gone way down. I used to make about a kitchen bag of trash every week, but now we'll go 2 or 3 weeks before having to take it out because we can throw so much in our bucket and smell isn't a concern."



FEEDBACK

Of the 252 who responded:

- 36% visit a drop-off site weekly or more
- 55% visit a drop-off site every other week- once a month
- 52% keep their compost container inside
- 48% keep their compost container outside
- 11% line with paper bags, 32% line with bpi bags, 55% do not line their container
- 64% drop off their container 100% full

FEEDBACK

- The drop-off locations are clean and functional.
 4.52 / 5
- It is important to me that the Ferndale businesses I visit participate in composting their food waste. 4.47/ 5
- It is important to me to compost to reduce the environmental impact of garbage. 4.78 / 5
- Those I live with think composting is a good idea. 4.61 / 5

SUGGESTIONS

- Better drop-off infrastructure
- Increased education for beginners
 - 10% want increased communication
- Larger signage
- Water spigot at drop-off to clean buckets
- More locations
