


Brighton Main Street Streetscape Project



AN OUTDATED MAIN STREET

The project sought to address the need for rejuvenating Main Street to cultivate a more inviting and inclusive sense of place for residents, businesses, and visitors. By prioritizing pedestrian accessibility and creating an environment that fosters comfort and usability for all, the project aimed to enhance the vibrancy of downtown, encourage community engagement, and support the economic vitality of local businesses.



THE VISION

To create an inviting environment on Brighton's Main Street with widened sidewalks, green spaces, and pedestrianfriendly amenities, prioritizing accessibility and comfort while promoting social interaction, economic vitality, and cultural enrichment.



THE PROCESS

The project involved a collaborative process guided by the city's 2018 Comprehensive Plan. Stakeholder input informed key decisions including careful planning and design. A series of open houses were held for public input and collaboration.



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The project's success is attributed to extensive community engagement and collaboration. It was organized it into three phases, based upon input from merchants. Each phase included initiatives such as merchant education, media coverage, signage, a shopping map, a mobile app, shuttle services, PSAs, and community events. Engaging stakeholders, particularly business owners, in the design process cultivates ownership and inclusivity.




THE IMPROVEMENTS

The project addresses essential infrastructure needs in the downtown area by replacing century-old utility lines. These upgrades are crucial for the local economy, supporting businesses and ensuring the community's long-term viability.
