


What is a River For All?

A **River for All** is a project of the City of Grand Rapids that includes the design of 6 park sites along the Grand River and the creation of design guidelines. The design guidelines apply to the entire 7.5 mile river trail that will someday flank both sides of the Grand River from Riverside Park to the north and Millennium Park to the south.

Grand Rapids Master Plan




